A Loving Family -The Best Cure for Abused, Abandoned or Neglected Children

Four (4) abused, abandoned or neglected children have been placed in permanent, loving homes during the last several months as a result of the Ettie Lee Adoption / Foster Family Program. And, in the next 4 months, Saundra Johnson, Director of Foster Care for Ettie Lee Youth & Family Services, projects being able to place an additional 19 children in the permanent, loving homes of our very own Foster Families. That will be a total of 23 children placed in 2006. In 2005 a total of 10 children were placed in permanent homes.

"It's been taking Ettie Lee Youth & Family Services less time to place children into permanent loving placements," says Johnson, "And for the children's sake, the sooner they feel that they are in a secure, loving home the better," continued Johnson. What took any where from 18 months to 24 months for a good placement, now takes about 12-15 months total.

It only took a few months to place Jerry with Ettie Lee foster parents. The foster parents welcomed Jerry into their home permanently at the very difficult age of 14. Today, 4 years later, Jerry is a college student and living with his biological brother. Both Jerry and his brother still remember their biological parents who were not able to raise them due to drug abuse.

Although licensed as an adoption agency for 10 years, Ettie Lee Youth & Family Services has not used their license for permanent placements until now. For the past several months they have been conducting the necessary home studies and are recruiting and training staff needed to place abused, neglected and abandoned children into loving homes.

Ettie Lee Youth & Family Services is now ready to begin to implement the complex, purposeful and deliberate operation of matching and placing abused, abandoned and neglected children into permanent homes - homes that are already in the Ettie Lee Foster Family Agency (FFA).

Not every foster agency is able to act as both a foster agency and an adoption agency. "We are in the very unique position of being able to place a child in the best home possible for them," said Johnson, "because we will be placing these children in the homes of foster parents that are already in the Ettie Lee family. We have a history with, and trust these families. We know that each placement will be the right placement for both the child and the family. We will really feel confident about each and every placement."

Ms. Johnson also went on to note that many of the children being placed are less than 6 years old. "What this means," said Johnson, "is that the assimilation process into the family, the lack of behavioral issues of children at this age adds to the success of each and every child placed in a loving home that has the Ettie Lee Youth & Family Services stamp of approval. "Statistics are not available at this time that explain the increase in the number of younger children that are waiting to be placed", Johnson says,

"but we know that drugs and alcohol - especially meth-amphetamine use has a lot do with children being abandoned and neglected by their biological parents."

While children are in Ettie Lee's Foster Family Program, they are continually monitored. If necessary, Ettie Lee can provide substance abuse treatment and mental health programs. All aspects of addiction and relapse prevention are addressed in the drug and health education segment of treatment. Focus is placed on the health needs of one's mind as well as

body, and how participants take control of meeting those needs. Daily activities in the mental health program could include individual, family and group therapy; drug/alcohol prevention, education; gang intervention; independent living skills; and specialized group activities that address such problems as victim issues, anger management, drug involvement and family issues.

Jerry is just one of the hundreds of children and youth Ettie Lee Youth & Family Services work with each and every year. LIVES WE ARE WORKING TO CHANGE

The following are profiles of some of the young people we have worked with in our Residential Care Facilities and Foster Homes. Their names have been changed to protect their confidentiality.

Children taking guns to school has become a reality in today's society. Frank was one such child. He said that he took the unloaded gun to school because it "made me feel big and important." Frank threatened a classmate and ended up in placement at Ettie Lee Youth & Family Services. At the age of 12, Frank has seen a lot of guns, rage and death in his neighborhood. Ettie Lee as able to take him out of his environment and help him deal with his problems and family.

Frank worked intensively with his Ettie Lee therapist who also worked with his family to help them to sort out their own problems and learn how to help Frank. Today, everyone has done a great job in therapy. They are working on parenting issues, communications and problem-solving skills. Someday we hope they will be together as a family again.

John has experienced more negative life cir-

cumstances than most adults will encounter in their lifetime. He was raised by a father who was in and out of jail and had little time to spend with John. A gang became John's family. When he came to Ettie Lee Youth & Family Services, John was a very difficult young man and

We tried lots of different ways to reach out to him. After a lot of conversations and therapy, we learned that John had another family member that might be able to take him into their home. We contacted them and today they are working on towards becoming a family. Though John has had his ups and downs, he has come a long way. His schoolwork has improved tremendously; he plays on the football team and is very popular with everyone that he meets. His attitude has improved 110% and he is now a very positive young man. While John was at Ettie Lee he had seen another way of life, one filled with hope and promise. He has set goals for himself and is determined to fill each and every one! John still has a long way to go, but we all believe that he can do it. Good luck, John!!
