Lee Youth & Family Services completed our first adoption in February 2008. What could be better than that you might ask? Ettie Lee completed their second adoption on August 18...That's when Esmerelda Mendoza and Alvaro Salazar formally adopted Michael. Michael has been with the couple since he was a few days old.

There's more! Ettie Lee completed three more adoptions on Friday August 22. Melody 2, Wally 3 and Hailey 6–all siblings were adopted by three of our foster families. Hailey was adopted by Maria Lara. Hailey has been in Maria's home for a year. Wally was adopted by Adrianna and Mauro Pino who took him in as a foster child two years ago. Melody was adopted by Ettie Lee foster parents Blanca and Isidro Espadas. Melody has been with her family since birth.

What? More? On the same day that Melody, Wally and Hailey were adopted, their two older siblings Bradley and Savannah were also adopted by Irene Velazquez a foster/adopt mom outside of Ettie Lee.

What makes this a most unique situation are the positive relationships that were formed between ALL of the adoptive parents—including the "outside" family. Every month ALL of the families get together. Although they will not see each other every day, they will see each other throughout the year because the parents know how important it is for all of the siblings to have each other.

And, Saundra Johnson, our foster family/adoption agency director, reported that in the next couple of months, she hopes to have finalized five more adoptions!

# From the President's Desk

n October 22, 2008 the Oak Knolls home in Azusa will formally become the Linda Brandes Home. We are in the final planning stages of the formal dedication

ceremony. The board of directors of Ettie Lee will host dignitaries from the surrounding city, county and state governments, local businesses and agencies as well as donors, VIP's and the press. All gathered will celebrate long time donor Linda Brandes.

Linda Brandes has been a friend of Ettie Lee Youth & Family Services since 1996. She has been generous with her resources and has realized first hand that she can make a significant difference in the lives of the vulnerable children that Ettie Lee serves.

Several years ago Linda came to our rescue when she generously gave half of the funds needed to fully update Ettie Lee's technology needs. Other grantors then quickly followed, noting that half of the multi-thousand dollars of funding that was needed had already been received.

In 2006 Linda's generosity allowed us to carry out the long overdue, and very expensive, capital improvements at our nine homes. We were able to install new windows and flooring, purchase and install commercial stoves, water heaters, pool covers, tables and benches. We painted home exteriors, landscaped and repaired broken sidewalks and driveways as well as replaced furnishings.

And most recently, in 2007 Linda continued to demonstrate her commitment to Ettie Lee as her philanthropy reaches \$1,000,000.00.

The home has been called Oak Knolls because of the many oak trees that surround the property. The home, built in the 1920's, was the estate of a prominent doctor and his wife Helen Ovard. Upon her death many years ago, Mrs. Ovard donated the property to Ettie Lee. It is our only 2-story building that is home to eleven boys. Although the home has been adapted for our residents, it still has some of the fancy architectural details such as the two turret rooms.



# Tobi Nishikawa



Tobi Nishikawa has been working at Ettie Lee for over six years serving as our Lead Intake Social Worker. What is an Intake Social Worker, you ask? Tobi explains it this way.

Ettie Lee has a unique intake program. Unlike similar organizations, Ettie Lee employs licensed therapists as intake social workers, which makes the placement process more efficient. Tobi explained that having a therapist works as an advantage for prospective residents because they know the appropriate factors to look for when placing a resident into one of our homes. These factors include gang affiliation; behavior (timid, aggressive etc.), age and ethnicity which help determine

which group home is best suited for the boy.

As the lead intake social worker, Tobi wears many hats. She is a therapist, an organizer, a screener, an evaluator and a publicist. Tobi works hard to keep our beds full at our nine group homes. She frequently acts as a spokesperson for Ettie Lee when she meets with probation officials, officers and the Department of Child and Family Services. She has to be ready at a moments notice when she is called to evaluate potential residents from all over the four counties we serve. Her success is made possible in part by the others in the intake department which include Alva Stewart, Intake Social Worker and Cindy Thatcher, Intake Coordinator.

# How Do I Write a Bequest to Ettie Lee?

veryone should have a will! However 6 out of 10 people do not. Making a provision in your will for our organization is a simple process. Such bequests can be included in your will as its creation or added and updated later by a codicil.

When making a bequest, it is important to name precisely the individuals and organizations you intend to benefit. By avoiding generalities such as a common name for an organization, you avoid confusion or possible litigation and ensure that your donation reached its intended beneficiary.

While not necessary, it is helpful to make us aware that we are being named in your will. This way you can be sure your bequest will be executed in the manner you intended. In addition, Ettie Lee Youth & Family Services would like to recognize donors who have named us in their wills. Furthermore, public recognition of your generosity can inspire others to consider supporting Ettie Lee Youth & Family Services.

There are two different ways to make gifts to us through your will, with varying tax benefits. The simplest and most popular approach is an outright bequest. Below is the wording you can use when writing a charitable bequest to us:


